Chocs top for sweet win

A chocolate house, violin and sea theme scored top marks in the eyes of the judges at the 2004 Royal Melbourne Dairy Show.

George Magganas and his team from Nina's Chocolates, Gymea, were awarded a perfect 100 for their novelty inventions at the show where they won eight gold and 20 silver medals. Nina's was named most successful chocolate exhibitor.

Gold was awarded for a product which scored 90 to 100 points and silver for 80 to 90. Most successful exhibitor is based on the overall score.

The team entered 34 products and some that

did not score a medal missed out by half a point.

The success follows the business's win at the 2004 Sydney Royal Easter at which it was named most successful chocolate exhibitor and won four gold, nine silver and 10 bronze medals.

Mr Magganas hopes to round off the successful year at the finals of the NSW Champion of Champions competition in which Nina's is entered in the manufacturing category.

Nina's also won the award, which will be announced on Saturday, last year.
